Dear Colleagues,

I reminded the local authority in Kleve of my request in this matter.

The competent officer for [REDACTED] from Kevelaer informed me, that there is presently no information available concerning the Penelopides-specimens on the "Herkunftsnachweis" of November 9, 2016.

These birds are not registered in Kleve at the regional authority.

According to our national law no special marking method is noted in the "Bundesartenschutzverordnung". So the closed footring would be the best, the microchip the second best method.

Mr. [REDACTED] claims the birds should have been bred by himself. But the regional authority received - up to now- not the necessary registration data.
